MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL MAY 11, 2022

Dear IHM families,

I invite you today to reflect upon a quote from the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops, or USCCB:

"While all members of the family are called to live out the foundational Christian virtues, fathers and mothers have a special responsibility for fostering these virtues within their children."

As an institution who is called to partner with parents in sharing the faith with our children, we echo similar sentiments throughout our school's mission statement and philosophy, as well as throughout our handbooks. The <u>Code of Christian Conduct</u>, which can be found in both our school and Archdiocesan handbook, states:

Students can best receive a quality, morally based education if students, parents/guardians, and school officials work together ... Students and parents/guardians shall follow standards of conduct that are consistent with the Christian principles of the school ... These Christian principles include but are not limited to:

- Parents/guardians are expected to work courteously and cooperatively with the school to assist the student in meeting the academic, moral, and behavioral expectations of the school.
- Students and parents/guardians may respectfully express their concerns about the school operation and its personnel. However, they may not do so in a manner that is discourteous, scandalous, rumor driven, disruptive, threatening, hostile, or divisive.
- Any parent/guardian or other person could risk his or her child's continuation in school if he or she insults or abuses the principal or any teacher in the presence of students, parents/guardians, or other school personnel while on school premises, public sidewalks, public streets, other public ways adjacent to school premises, or at some other place if the principal or teacher is required to be there in connection with assigned school activities.

Please take this into consideration when interacting with one another, monitoring your children's interactions with each other, interacting with IHM school and parish staff, and all members inside and outside of our IHM community. From the Immaculate Heart of Mary School and Parish staff, thank you for constantly entrusting us with your children. May we all continue to be models of our faith, remembering the example that Jesus set for us.
